



Osler names Etobicoke Wellness Centre

*New building to house
doctors' offices, outpatient
clinics, and more*

Etobicoke General Hospital's transformation continues and the site's two new buildings are taking shape – with one recently christened as the Etobicoke Wellness Centre (EWC).

The new six-storey EWC will provide Etobicoke residents with even greater access to care. At more than double the size of the existing medical office building, the EWC will be home to a new 30-station satellite dialysis program, physicians' offices, IT training rooms, a fracture clinic and outpatient programs and services.

Etobicoke General's new four-storey patient tower is also progressing well. When opened in late 2018, the patient tower will be home



to the services most urgently needed by the community, including a larger emergency department, expanded cardiac care, intensive

care, and maternal newborn areas, as well as a new ambulatory procedures units and cardiorespiratory and neurodiagnostic services.

Enhanced discharge process provides greater access to care

Osler continues to look at ways of providing patients with even greater access to care while in the hospital and beyond. With a seven per cent Alternate Level of Care (ALC) rate, the lowest of all Ontario hospitals, Osler is ensuring patients are discharged and transitioned into the

community more seamlessly. The ALC rate measures the percentage of inpatient beds occupied by patients no longer requiring acute medical care. Osler continues efforts to improve its discharge process with the support of local health care partners in the community.

TIPS FOR A HEALTHY *Holiday Season*

Go to the Emergency Department IF YOU HAVE:

- Pains or tightness in the chest, shortness of breath, severe abdominal pain
- Broken bones or wounds that may need stitches
- Sudden severe headaches, vision problems, weakness, numbness and/or tingling in the face, arm or leg, trouble speaking, or dizziness
- A child who is vomiting, has diarrhea and won't eat or drink
- A baby under six months with a fever over 37.9°C or 100°F
- Call **9-1-1** if you feel that your illness or injury is an emergency or potentially life threatening

- If you have visitors staying for the holidays, remind them to refill their prescriptions before they leave home
